

RECOGNIZING AND REPORTING CHILD MALTREATMENT

Any person who works with or around children, or is responsible for the care and/or custody of children, is a mandated reporter. This 90-minute training is for mandated reporters, including school personnel, victim advocates, medical and mental health professionals, parents, guardians, stepparents, foster parents, volunteers, caretakers, childcare providers, faith-based personnel, peace officers, child welfare investigators, and any other person who has responsibility for the care or treatment of a child.
